



### Parent's feedback

The primary intent behind this analysis is to distill insights about the parents experience and pinpoint areas necessitating enhancements.

A total of 217 parents' have submitted the feedback.






Excellent: 28 (12.9%), Very Good: 169 (78.3%), Good: 20 (9.2%), Average: 0 (0%), Below

Average: 0 (0%)

Analysis: The majority of parents (169 out of 217) rated the learning experience of their wards as "very good," with 28 rating it as "excellent" and 20 as "good." This indicates a high level of satisfaction among parents regarding the quality of education provided by the college.



Excellent: 23 (10.6%), Very Good: 155 (71.4%), Good: 39 (18%), Average: 0 (0%), Below Average: 0 (0%)

Analysis: Over three-quarters of parents (82%) expressed satisfaction with the resources available to students, with a significant portion rating them as "Very Good." This suggests that the college provides adequate facilities and materials to support learning.


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

Parent's Feedback & Alumni Feedback 2021-22




Excellent: 40 (18.4%), Very Good: 132 (60.8%), Good: 41 (18.9%), Average: 4 (1.8%), Below Average: 0 (0%)

Analysis: A considerable number of parents (132 out of 217) rated the teachers and mentors provided by the college as "very good," with 40 rating them as "excellent" and 41 as "good." However, there are 4 responses indicating an average rating, which may require further investigation to address any concerns.



Excellent: 37 (17.1%), Very Good: 135 (62.2%), Good: 43 (19.8%), Average: 2 (0.9%), Below Average: 0 (0%)


Analysis: The majority of parents (135 out of 217) believe that the college environment is conducive to the overall development of their wards, with 37 rating it as "excellent" and 43 as "good".



Excellent: 33 (15.2%), Very Good: 128 (59.0%), Good: 55 (25.3%), Average: 1 (0.5%), Below Average: 0 (0%)

Analysis: While a significant number of parents (128 out of 217) rated the exposure to career orientation as "very good," there are still 55 responses indicating a "good" rating. This suggests that there might be room for improvement in providing more comprehensive career guidance and exposure opportunities.


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Excellent: 28 (12.9%), Very Good: 146 (67.3%), Good: 43 (19.8%), Average: 0 (0%), Below


Average: 0 (0%)

Analysis: Similar to the previous section, a combined 80.2% of parents perceived the college environment as encouraging open communication, allowing students to comfortably discuss their problems.



Excellent: 29 (13.4%), Very Good: 136 (62.6%), Good: 50 (23.1%), Average: 2 (0.9%), Below

Analysis: A considerable proportion of parents (136 out of 217) find the authorities easily approachable regarding any queries, with 29 rating it as "excellent" and 50 as "good." Similarly, a majority (148 out of 217) are satisfied with the communication regarding the regular




Analysis: While nearly 80% of parents acknowledged receiving communication regarding their children's performance, a significant portion (19.4%) rated it as "Good," suggesting potential for enhancing the frequency, detail, or clarity of such communication.

Overall, the feedback reflects a positive perception of the college experience among parents. Parents expressed high levels of satisfaction with the learning experience, resources, teachers and mentors, and the overall college environment. However, there are areas for improvement, particularly in career guidance and communication of student performance. The college can address these areas by:

 Enhancing career exploration opportunities and providing more detailed guidance on career paths.

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
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
## Alumni Feedback

The primary intent behind this analysis is to distill insights about the Alumni's experience and pinpoint areas necessitating enhancements.


A total of 311 alumni have submitted the feedback.



Strongly Agree: 74, Agree: 198, Neutral: 25, Disagree: 6, Strongly Disagree: 8 Analysis: The majority of respondents (272 out of 311) agree or strongly agree that the course content and curriculum align well with industry/higher education requirements. This indicates a positive perception of the relevance and quality of our academic offerings.



Strongly Agree: 64, Agree: 201, Neutral: 32, Disagree: 7, Strongly Disagree: 7 Analysis: A significant number of respondents (265 out of 311) acknowledge the regular organization of co-curricular activities for the overall development of students. This indicates a well-rounded approach to education.




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


Strongly Agree: 57, Agree: 200, Neutral: 35, Disagree: 10, Strongly Disagree: 9 Analysis: While a majority (257 out of 311) perceive academia-industry interaction as encouraging, there's room for improvement in fostering stronger ties between academia and industry to better prepare students for the professional world.



Strongly Agree: 49, Agree: 182, Neutral: 36, Disagree: 23, Strongly Disagree: 21 Analysis: While a considerable number of respondents (231 out of 311) acknowledge faculty support for placement/higher education, there's a notable proportion expressing dissatisfaction. Addressing this issue could enhance students' career prospects and academic pursuits.




Strongly Agree: 77, Agree: 183, Neutral: 37, Disagree: 7, Strongly Disagree: 7 Analysis: The majority of respondents (260 out of 311) perceive the learning ambience at the college positively. This indicates a conducive environment for academic growth and development.




Strongly Agree: 61, Agree: 187, Neutral: 44, Disagree: 11, Strongly Disagree: 8

**Analysis:** A significant number of respondents (248 out of 311) acknowledge the availability of adequate laboratories and equipment for practical experiences, although there's room for improvement in addressing neutral and negative responses.



Strongly Agree: 65, Agree: 197, Neutral: 36, Disagree: 6, Strongly Disagree: 7


Analysis: The majority of respondents (262 out of 311) perceive the academic process as transparent and systematic. This reflects positively on the college's organizational efficiency.



Strongly Agree: 56, Agree: 212, Neutral: 35, Disagree: 1, Strongly Disagree: 7

Analysis: A significant majority (268 out of 311) perceive the college as student-centric in all academic initiatives, indicating a strong focus on student welfare and development.

Student Grievances Redressal System:



Strongly Agree: 62, Agree: 192, Neutral: 38, Disagree: 9, Strongly Disagree: 10

Analysis: While a majority (254 out of 311) acknowledge the presence of an appropriate student grievances redressal system, there's a need to address the concerns of neutral and dissatisfied respondents to ensure effective grievance resolution.

Based upon above two feedbacks following suggestions were provided for the areas of improvement.

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- Continuously upgrade laboratories and equipment to meet evolving educational and industry standards.
- Strengthen academia-industry collaborations to enhance students' employability and exposure to real-world challenges.
